Thank you for contributing to our Holiday Hampers this year! With your donations, we were able to bring a little bit of extra joy to families within our community.



## In **Room 7** we are working on spelling, capitalization, and punctuation by doing a daily

edit in the mornings. First, the teacher writes a message on the board with lots of mistakes in it. Students then use their individual white boards and dry-erase markers to make corrections as they see fit. Once everyone has



finished making their own corrections, we correct the whole message as a class.

In **Room 6**, students are actively collaborating in teams to solve mathematical problems and present their solutions to the group. This approach fosters deep



mathematical thinking as students spend more time articulating and explaining their reasoning while also learning from their peers.

First, they apply their knowledge in practice by suggesting ideas to support their team. Next, they engage in meaningful discussions, refining their thinking through collaboration. Finally, they sharpen their problem-solving skills by considering feedback and critiques from others.

Students also enjoy independent study time, using it to self-reflect and evaluate their own understanding. This process encourages maturity, critical thinking, and peer review, helping students grow into confident and capable mathematicians. Filipino Bilingual Program Choir participated in the Holiday Open House at the Legislative Building on December 7, 2024. The kids serenaded the audience with Silent Night (Talang Patnubay) and Pasko Na Naman.





The students are taking turns in reading and the students are able to practice in using various reading techniques in order to enhance their learning. Apart from reading, Room 6 is also practicing subtraction with the assistance of their buddies.
