IF YOUR CHILD REQUIRES MEDICATION AT SCHOOL...

- I. The medication must be delivered to the school by a parent or responsible adult.
- The medication must have an official label from a pharmacy (no over-the-counter medicines can be given as per school division policy).

EMERGENCIES AT SCHOOL

In order to prepare for emergencies at school, we hold 10 fire drills and 2 lock-



down drills per year. All students are asked to have a pair of indoor shoes at school at all times so they are prepared for a drill. A letter to parents and guardians is sent home prior to lockdown drills to inform families of the procedure.

In the event that we need to evacuate students and staff, we would go to the Ben Zaidman Educational Resource Centre or École Seven Oaks Middle School. Once there, we would contact parents/guardians at home or at work to pick up their children.

Guidelines and Procedures

LUNCH AND SNACKS AT SCHOOL

Many students bring food to school and eat in their classrooms during our two nutrition breaks. Encouraging healthy eating and teaching children about nutritious foods and treats (or "sometimes" foods) is a component of our Health curriculum. We ask parents not to send pop and sugary snacks to school with their children. We are not offering milk for purchase at this time. If you wish to send warm food, please use a thermos container, as microwaves are not available for reheating food. Please send utensils with your child as well. There is **no cost** to parents to have their children eat lunch at school.



Please review the following expected behaviours with your child:

- I. Children must be seated at a desk or table while they eat lunch.
- 2. Appropriate table manners and speaking voices are taught.
- 3. When the break is over, children are asked to clean up after themselves and get ready for the activity break.



BUSSING

Applications are required for bussing, and certain restrictions apply. Students who ride the bus are expected to behave in a safe and appropriate manner at all times.

IF YOUR CHILD IS NOT TAKING THE **BUS BUT USUALLY DOES...**

call transportation (204) 338-705 I and the school (204) 586-9716 to let the teacher and staff know. We require this information as early as possible in the day.

WE ARE A PEANUT-CONSCIOUS **SCHOOL**

Given the number of students with life-threatening allergies to peanuts, we are a PEANUT-CONSCIOUS school. We ask that you look for the peanut-free label when buying snack and lunch items, and not to send foods containing peanuts to school.

SEVERE WEATHER

If you are unsure whether or not there is school on a stormy day, please listen to / CBC Radio I (89.3) or check the Seven Oaks web site at www.7oaks.org.

Please note that if school buses are not running in the morning, they do not run at the end of the school day either.

REMAINING INDOORS FOR RECESSES

When the wind chill reaches -27C, or if it is raining hard, we keep the children indoors during recess breaks. Otherwise, children are expected to play outside and are asked to dress appropriately for the weather conditions (i.e. hats, mittens, warm footwear, etc.) Even when children have minor illnesses such as colds, they benefit from fresh air.

A good rule of thumb is that "if a child is well enough to attend school, they are well enough to go outside for recess."
