


Title: My Shadow is Pink

New Club! Mrs. Rumak has started an Indigenous Flute Club for Rooms 6 and 18. This club will be performing at Arts in the Park and the Victory School Treaty Day in June.

New Song!

Our students are exploring *mitêh (Heart)*, a powerful new composition by Sherryl Sewepagaham, written in Woodland Cree. *mitêh* centers on the heart as a place of connection: to ourselves, to one another, and to community. The Cree text reflects on the journey between thought and feeling and invites singers to return to empathy, care, and shared understanding through music. We are learning the pronunciation through an instructional video from MusiCounts. It features the composer introducing *mitêh*, sharing its meaning, and guiding students through the Cree text using listening and repetition.
