New Mission Statement: To provide afterschool opportunities that work alongside and empower community members.


Programming has seen great attendance, since our return. Notable schools include Arthur E Wright, Forest Park, O.V Jewitt and Victory with sold out programs.



Maples Youth Activity Centre (MYAC) and Kildonan Youth Activity Centre (KYAC) have come out of the pandemic and expanded to additional schools which offers a larger radius of neighborhoods to participate and connect. Since its re-launch in Spring of 2021, two MYAC schools have joined with newly added O.V Jewitt and Elwick returning. KYAC has also grown by two Early Year schools with Margaret Park and Victory School bringing our KYAC schools up to seven in total. Collectively, KYAC and MYAC offer programs at twelve community schools.




