

Kindergarten Registration is open

<u>Due to COVID-19, the 2021-22</u> Kindergarten registration will take place online.

For those families who are having difficulties applying online, they are to contact the school to make an appointment to register.

All children that are registering for Kindergarten <u>must be 5 years</u> <u>old by December 31st, 2021</u> (born in 2016) in order to register for Kindergarten starting in September 2021.

Immunization information from the WRHA will be made available online. Please ensure to share this information with those who call for appointment to register at their school.

You must provide:

- Proof of age
- Proof of address
- You must be the legal guardian to register the student.





The story behind the name:

"Back on September 27, 2018, Elder Dan Thomas and Elder Mary Courchene held a Naming and Pipe Ceremony on this land. Elder Mary Courchene shared that she had a dream where "Land-Based Teachings Learning Centre" came to her as a name for our new, shared place. When Elder Dan Thomas held the Pipe Ceremony, he had a vision of a big blue thunderbird "whose wings were outspread, covering this land here, that we are on". The first part of our name, "Ozhaawashkwaa Animikii-Bineshi" means Blue Thunderbird in the Ojibwe language. This is the spirit name for our centre. The second part of our name, "Aki Onji Kinimaagae' Inun" means Land-Based Teachings Learning Centre".



Doors are open during our rehearsals for better room ventilation and students still are requested to keep their masks on when they are not playing their instruments, but we are slowly coming back to our routine.




Congratulations Elwick band community – the restrictions are lifting, and we are hoping to play for our beautiful audience again in the close future.




ELWICK SCHOOLS' WALKING SCHOOL BUS CAN HELP...




If there is an older sibling, we encourage them to walk together, instead of using the walking school bus, to try and not make the group too large.

Did you know?

The International Day of Pink takes place on April 14, 2021!

- The Day of Pink started in 2007, when a grade nine student in Cambridge, Nova Scotia was bullied by classmates for wearing a pink shirt to school.
- Taking notice, two students rallied their peers to send a message to the bullies.
- The next day, the halls were filled with pink T-shirts.

- Day of Pink started because two boys chose to do something about bullying rather than stand by and watch it happen.
- Now the movement is worldwide, educating and inspiring others to stand together and take action against violence and bullying!

Discrimination

Discrimination is when someone or a group of people are treated unfairly. A person might be discriminated against because of their race, their age, gender identity, the way they look, their disabilities or their sexuality, to name a few. The 2SLGBTQIA+ community is no stranger to the bullying and violence that stems from hateful beliefs. While progress has been made towards removing these social barriers from our society, discrimination still persists. So, every



year, on the second Wednesday of April, we urge people around the world to put on a pink shirt and stand in solidarity with the 2SLGBTQIA+ community to continue fighting for equality and acceptance!

POWER


- Did you know that we all have different types of power?

- When power is used in a positive way, it helps other people in some way.




- It might help someone feel included, help them with a task they are having trouble with or help them feel safe and respected.

- It might make someone feel excluded, harm them physically or mentally, or force them to do something they don't want to.






Parents/Caregivers/Visitors
