Personal Land Acknowledgments from Room 30



Boozhoo Savvi nindizhinkaaz, India nindoonji, Winnipeg endaayaang.

Hi, my name is Savvi and I was born in India, raised half of my childhood there, but then my family decided to immigrate here for a better future, so I spent the other half of my childhood on Treaty 1 Land. The life that we came here to find is exactly the life that has been taken away from many of the folks that the land belongs to.

I acknowledge the Cree, Ojibway, Dakota, Oji-Cree, Anishinaabe, and Dakota and Dene people on Treaty 1 Territory of Turtle Island. I acknowledge that I live in the homeland of the Red River Métis Nation. I recognize the injustices of the past that continue to cause harm in the present. I apologize for the broken treaties, stolen land, murdered and missing Indigenous women, gender-based violence, and residential schools.

I dedicate myself to keeping this land clean and healthy, having a better relationship with the land and the people of this land.

Hi, my name is Ivan and I'm from Winnipeg.

We acknowledge we are gathering on Treaty 1 Territory and that Manitoba is located on the ancestral lands of the Anishnabeg, Anishininewuk, Dakota Oyate, Denesuline and Nehethowuk people and is the national homeland of the Red River Métis Nation. We acknowledge the harms & mistakes of the past, and we dedicate ourselves to move forward in partnerships with Indigenous communities in a spirit of reconciliation and collaboration.

My commitment to the land will be to take care of the world and others. And to learn Indigenous Histories and cultures, and to do what my ancestors used to do. Traditional ceremonies and ways of knowing are important because they were broken and not honored in the past. Indigenous people reclaiming their land and rights, is an essential piece of making the world a

better place.

Hi, my name is Gurleen and I was born and raised in Canada (Winnipeg). My family immigrated to treaty 1 territory for a better future in 2010.

I acknowledge the Cree, Ojibway, Anishinaabe, Dakota, and Dene people and that this is the national homeland of the Red River Métis Nation. I am aware of the harms and mistakes of the past and present, like stolen land, murdered and missing Indigenous women and girls, and residential schools. I acknowledge that Winnipeg gets its water from Shoal Lake First Nation. For forty years, the people of Shoal Lake were not getting clean water because Winnipeg was taking it all. The people in Shoal Lake had to boil their water or get water from the store and the water from the store was really expensive. At the same time, Winnipeg people were flushing their toilets and filling their swimming pools with the clean drinking water that they should have been sharing with the people of Shoal Lake.

Injustices like this must stop and I dedicate myself to having a better relationship with the land and the people of this land. This includes standing up for Indigenous water rights.


Music News
