Our community land acknowledgement today is from Ms. Flynn's grade 10 advocacy class: This land is our home and provides us with countless gifts -- water, shade, plants, animals, trees, medicine, and good memories of our favourite places. It is abundant and gives without asking anything in return.

We acknowledge and honour the fact that Indigenous People were the guardians of this land long before Settlers arrived. During colonization we took what was not ours; this damaged our relationship with Indigenous people and with the land.

For generations we have taken more than Earth can give. Soil, air, and oceans are degraded by plastic, garbage, and pollution. We apologize for the harm, seen and unseen, to our Indigenous relatives and to our Earth. Our choices and actions have damaged many beautiful places where we should have walked softly and been gentle.

It is our wish that our land acknowledgements help us honour our Indigenous relatives and our beautiful Earth. We are grateful for the land, the waters, and all living beings. Without them we have nothing. We hope all people will show respect for the Earth by cleaning up garbage, reducing pollution, and consuming less to ensure our planet becomes a better place.

We commit to protecting our Earth and showing gratitude for her gifts which are so freely offered. We promise to respect our Indigenous kin and to live peacefully. We will try to replant the great

forests and heal the land's spirit. We commit to rewilding our Earth, to protecting the sacred waters, and to bringing new life to places she has been hurt. We will strive to create a future where we are deeply connected to the land and all its peoples.
