We take time to acknowledge that we are here on Treaty 1 Territory, and to honour the Peoples and lands of Turtle Island. Treaty 1 land is on the traditional territories of the Anishinaabe, Inninewak, and Dakota peoples, and the homeland of the Red River Metis.

Our water comes from Anishinaabe Treaty 3 territory from the waters of Shoal Lake First Nation #39 and #40.

The electricity powering our community comes from generating stations on river in Treaty territories 1, 3, and 5. The Northern Flood Agreement with five Indigenous communities in northern Manitoba remains unfulfilled.

We are committed to our Treaty relationship. As a school community, we continually reflect on how we are contributing towards reconciliation today and everyday.

There is no cost for children under 19 years for an eye examination by an optometrist in Manitoba?

Kindergarten and Grade 1 students will be getting their vision screened by Lions Club volunteers on **Thurs, Jan 19**, 2023 at AEW.


Grades 3, 5, 7 and any **new students** will be getting their vision screened during the week of **January 23-27** at AEW.

Middle Years Treaty One Flag Initiative

Students in grades 7 and 8 have successfully advocated for the Treaty One flag to fly outside our school on its own flagpole. Keep your eyes peeled for its installation. We are the first school in the Division to have the flag fly on our grounds. However, our students did not stop there. They presented to the Board of Trustees to propose the flag be flown in front of every school in the Division and were very well -received. This is an example of how our students are working to honour the Treaty relationship and are acting toward reconciliation. Below is an example one of the letters students wrote to our Superintendent.

Hello and good day Mr.O'Leary,

My name is Kris Galicia and I've been attending Arthur E Wright Community School since kindergarten and I'm currently in 8th grade. My classmates and I are writing to you for the purpose of raising the Treaty 1 flag alongside the Canadian flag in front of our school.


We realize and understand that you have to propose this request to the Board Of Trustees and await their approval for this; however, we greatly suggest doing so. Other provinces have the flag raised proudly on their school grounds, as well as the University of Manitoba. I feel as someone who is not of Indigenous descent that the people of the culture have been done an injustice not yet resolved, and raising the Treaty 1 flag will educate and bring Indigenous people and their struggle a little closer to the light.

Indigenous people have been mistreated and discriminated against for so many years, and though the Treaty 1 flag may not have been around for very long, the meaning runs deep and we hope you agree. My class as well as our entire school community will appreciate your response.




Think Pink







