Today's community land acknowledgement is from Mme Bisht and Mme Ly's grade 10 Advocacy, read is Ron: Nous vivons, apprenons et travaillons sur le territoire du Traité no 1, la terre traditionnelle des peuples Cree, Oji-Cri, Anishinaabe, Dene et Dakota, et la patrie des Métis de la rivière Rouge. La colonisation a blessé les peuples autochtones, leurs cultures et a même assimilé et gentrifié leurs traditions et leurs connaissances. Nous avons la responsabilité de prendre soin de la terre, de réconcilier avec les peuples autochtones et de montrer du respect en apprenant, en protégeant la nature et en soutenant l'équité dans notre communauté. Dans nos salles de classe multiculturelles, nous célébrons nos différences, apprenons les uns des autres et construisons un avenir meilleur et plus respectueux.

We recognize that we (immigrants and the descendants of immigrants) live, work, and learn on Treaty One territory. The traditional lands of the Cree, Oji-Cree, Anishinaabe, Dene, and Dakota peoples, and the homeland of the Red River Metis.
