
Cards for Care!

Room 21 – Ms. Richards Class Wampum Belts

In Room 21, we have been learning about the First Peoples of Canada. We have been learning about wampum belts and how they represent some of the first treaties that were ever made. We made our wampum belts in small groups to represent our promise to work collaboratively and respectfully together. To make our belts, we first made black and white paper beads which represent the shells used in original wampum belts. We then sewed the beads between strips of felt to create images or scenes that depict our agreements. The belts are hung in Room 21 to remind us of our agreements, much like the original wampum belts would have been displayed at ceremonies and gatherings.
