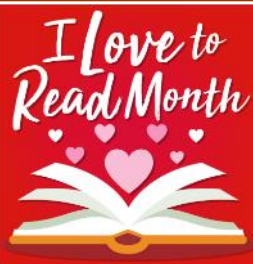

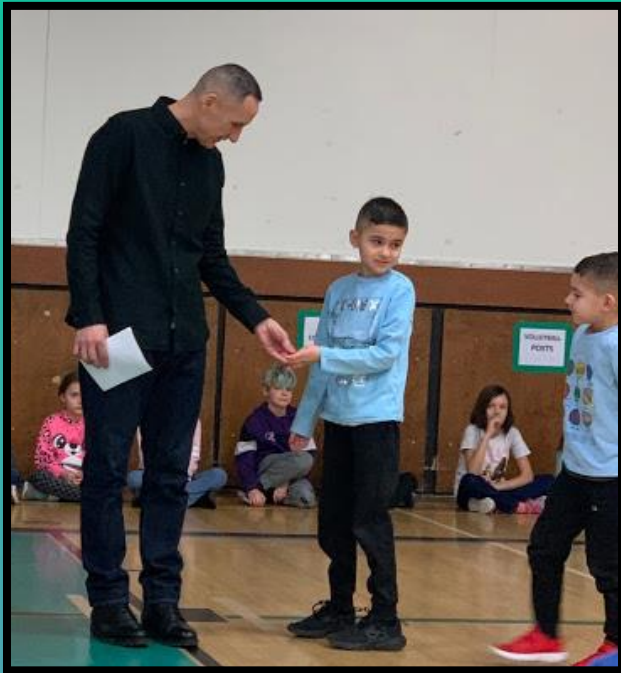

Ancient Greece vs Ancient Rome

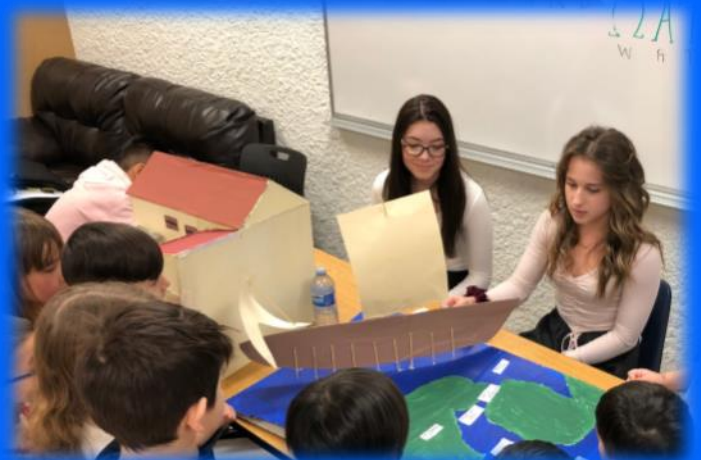
Team Ancient Rome

The program is open to everyone – whether they speak Filipino or not.

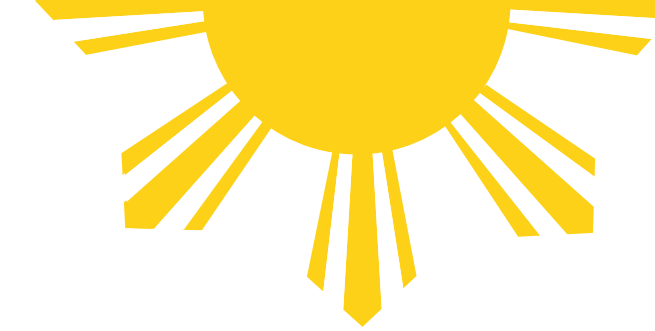
The program is about sharing, celebrating and experiencing the Filipino language and culture with one another, regardless of heritage.

Ang programa ay bukas para sa lahat – nagsasalita man ng Filipino o hindi.

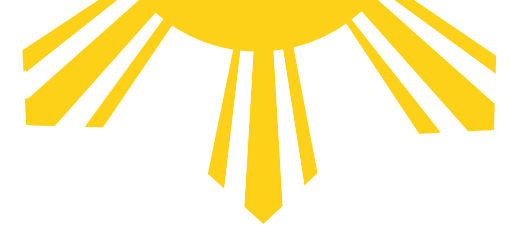

The goal of our K-4 Ojibwe Bilingual Program is to shape our students into language and knowledge keepers who ensure the stories and words of yesterday and today are shared for generations to come.

Speaking, reading and writing Anishinaabemowin helps students reclaim their roots, take pride in their identities and shed some of the shame history has placed upon their culture.

Classes are taught by Anishinaabe teachers who know and live the culture. Lessons – rooted in numerous traditional teachings – involve many hands-on experiences that help enrich students' cultural and language growth.

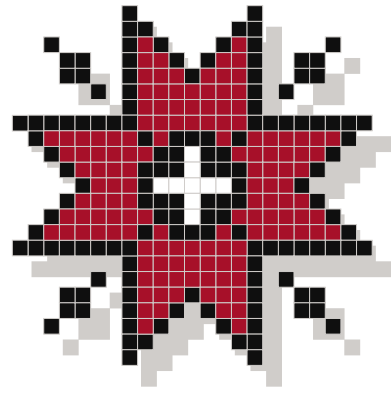

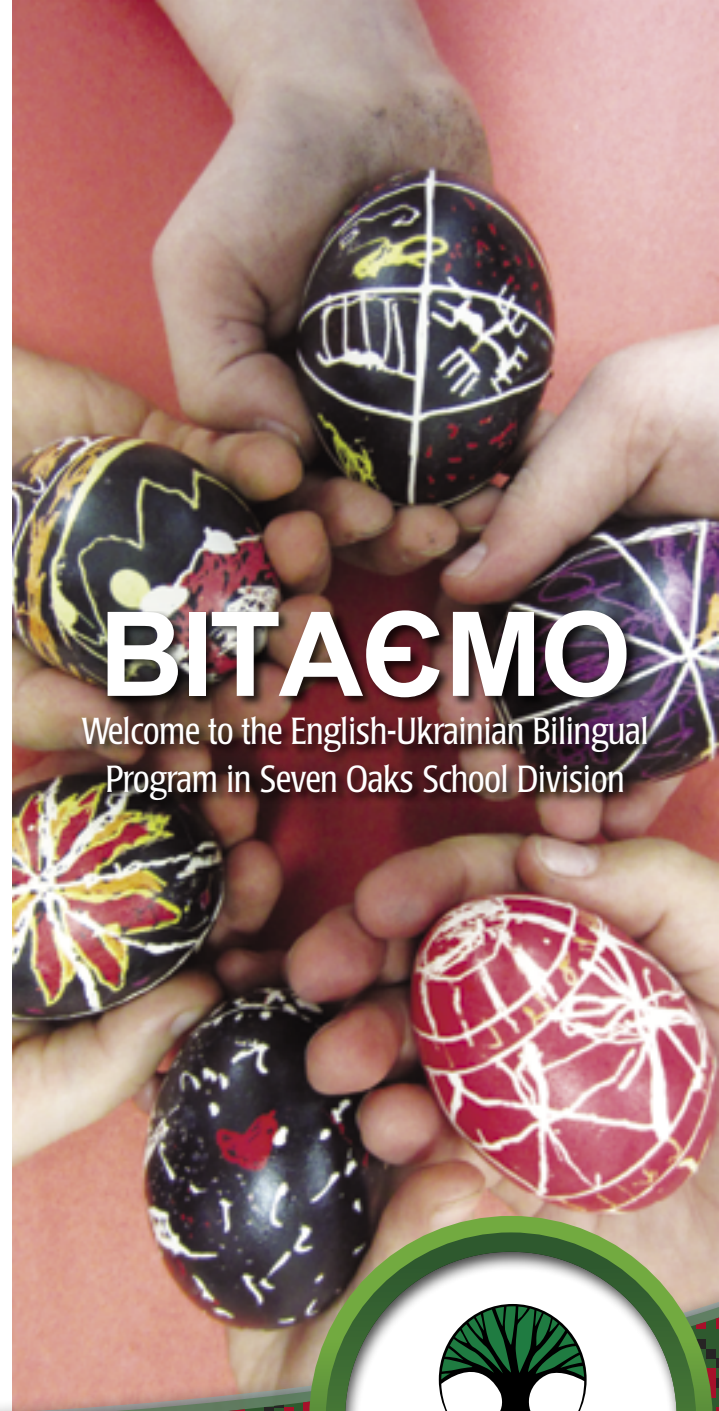

About the Program

The goal of our K-8 English-Ukrainian Bilingual Program is to enrich children's educational experience by honouring Ukrainian language, culture and tradition.

Speaking, reading and writing Ukrainian helps students develop language skills, gain insight into one of the cultures that formed the Seven Oaks community as we know it today and preserve part of a heritage that may otherwise be lost.

Classes are taught by bilingual teachers who know and live the culture and deliver lessons from a diverse perspective.



Our English-Ukrainian Bilingual Program is open to everyone.

Students and their parents are not required to speak Ukrainian or come from a Ukrainian background to enjoy the benefits of a multilingual education, steeped with rich Manitoba history.

Benefits of the English-Ukrainian Bilingual Program:

- Language learning develops creative and critical thinking skills
- Supports children in developing an appreciation of cultural diversity
- Enhances personal and cultural identity
- Explores many facets of Ukrainian culture and celebrates its traditions
- Opens doors to exciting career opportunities and further studies in Ukrainian

Students receive instruction in core subject areas in both Ukrainian and English. Lessons are taught in each language approximately half the day.

Grades K-6 at Школа R.F. Morrison School

Ukrainian language skills are developed in a variety of ways involving music, games, drama and cultural activities.

Students spend up to half of the school day studying Ukrainian Language Arts, Social Studies, Health, Art, Music and Physical Education. The study of Basic French begins formally at Grade 4. Mathematics, Science and English Language Arts are taught in English.

Grades 7-8 at H.C. Avery Middle School

Students have an option of taking a Ukrainian class in Grades 7-8 as a core language program that runs every other day.

Students who participate have either completed the English Ukrainian Bilingual Program at the elementary level or come from a background where they are proficient in the Ukrainian language.

- U7 Division 2014 and 2013 born players. 10 half-rink floor times and 4 full-rink floor times; focus is on introduction to the game and skill development.
- U9 Division 2012 and 2011 born players. 2 half-rink practices and 12 full-rink games plus single elimination playoffs.
- U11 Division 2010 and 2009 born players. 2 practices and 12 games plus single elimination playoffs.
- U13 Division 2008 and 2007 born players. 2 practices and 12 games plus single elimination playoffs
- U15 Division 2006 and 2005 born players. 1 practices and 13 games plus single elimination playoffs
- U17 Division 2004 and 2003 born players. 1 practice and 13 games plus single elimination playoffs
- U12 Female Division 2010, 2009, 2008 – 2 practices and 12 games plus single elimination playoffs

- Game days will be scheduled Monday to Thursday as well as Sundays (if necessary). Game days and times will vary from week to week. **NO SET DAYS**.
- Average of two floor times per week; earliest start time is 6:00pm during the week. Younger divisions will get the earlier start times.
- Games will be two 20-minute periods (run time) with five players and a goalie on the floor per team.
- Division adjustments will be made after five games to ensure skill levels are as close as possible.
- Season begins April 27th, 2020 and finishes at the end of June 2020

Player Fee Information

- U5 Division cost is \$99, this includes 14 Camp floor times and T-Shirt.
- U7 Division cost is \$120, this includes 14 floor times and a team T-Shirt.
- All other division cost is \$240, which includes 14 floor times (plus playoffs) and a team jersey.
- Full team registration cost is \$3,600. Team General Manager must collect money and turn in before deadline. (12 min players to 19 player max); \$3200 if team supplies its own jerseys (league must approve color, logo and name).

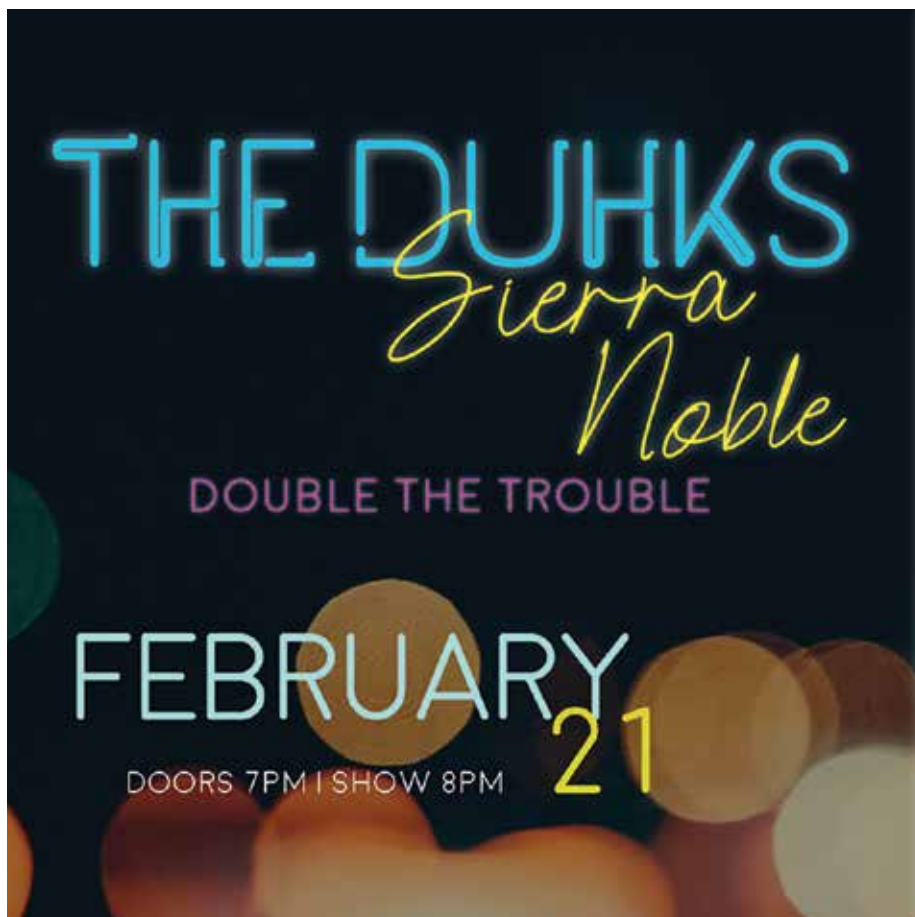

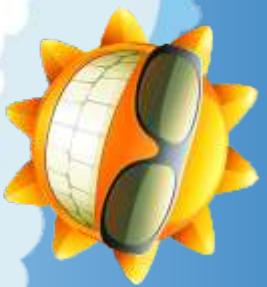
