

As part of our emergency preparedness planning, we have 2 planned Lockdown practices, as well as 10 planned fire drills per year. We do this in order to ensure that should an emergency arise, we are all prepared. If the fire alarm sounds when it is very cold out and we are waiting for the okay to re-enter the building, we do have access to our community centre in the back field, so that we can keep warm. If something occurs where we have to evacuate our school, our primary evacuation site is the Seven Oaks Adult Learning Centre, located at 950 Jefferson Avenue. Our alternate evacuation site is James Nisbet Community School located at 70 Doubleday Dr.


eadership Students
