


Crosswalk Safety

As a school, we recognize that crosswalk safety is becoming a concern for our students and their families. We all have a shared responsibility in ensuring that our children who are using active transportation reach the school safely whenever they use our crosswalks. We have amazing student patrols and staff who are helping pedestrians so they can cross the street safely (weather permitting) in the morning from 8:40–8:55 a.m., during lunch break from 10:55-11:05 and 11:45-11:55, and at home time from 3:30–3:45 p.m. We also have our School Resource Officer (SRO) who helps us from time to time in our crosswalks.

We ask our parents/guardians not to drop off or pick up their child/ren using our back lane as the school's parking lot is only designated for staff and visitor use.

I Want Peace


Congratulations to Samantha Garingarao, Grade 4 from Room 11 for her beautiful piece, **I Want**


Quel Temps Fait-II? C'est froid! By Room 11

It's Cool 2 Be Kind!



decided to give to the school so that






