






TURTLE ISLAND

Children in Mrs. Ingram's room shared what they saw when looking up at the clouds!



As part of their inquiry about weather and the environment the children have been learning about the various types of clouds as well as how clouds are formed! They used their imaginations to see lots of different things in the sky!

advisories.**






