We know that technology plays a big part in the lives of many of our children and we know how important it is to give them the tools and information to safely navigate this digital world.

Did You Know

- Approximately 15% of youth ages 10-17 have had a person contact them over the internet with a message that was sexual in content
- Approximately 32% of kids delete browsing history, have e-mail accounts under a pseudonym or lie about their age online and when setting up online accounts.
- Many social media websites require participants to be OVER 17 years of age. Make sure to check sites your children subscribe to in order to ensure age restrictions are being followed.

How to Keep Kids Safe

- Monitor your child's online activity
- Keep open lines of communication with your child and encourage them to come to you if anything is bothering them
- Remind them to "Think Before they Post!"

Most of the time that you are online, you will have lots of fun. However, if you see anything that makes you feel uncomfortable or worried, make sure that you tell an adult that you trust.



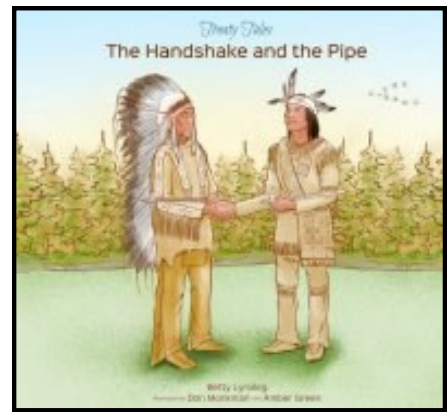
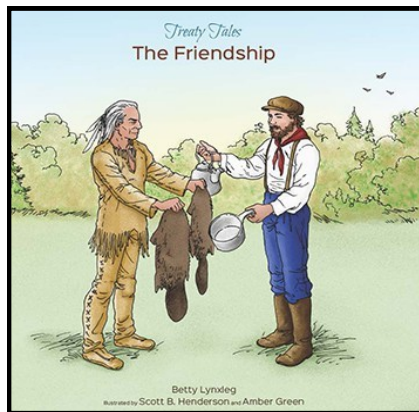
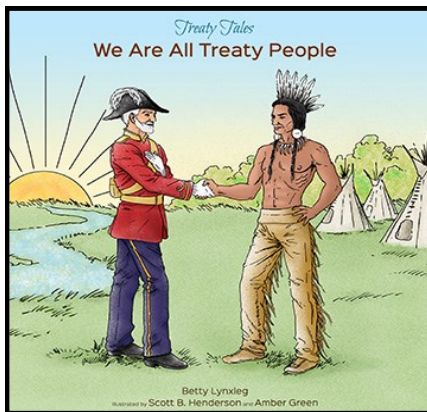

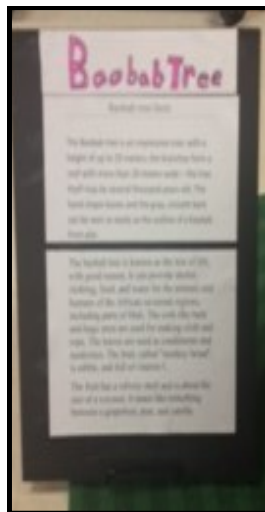
At AEW we love any opportunity we can get to celebrate the learning in our school! We are so pleased to be able to offer you a peek into the work we do here!
