Personal Land Acknowledgments from Room 30

Hello my name is Karampreet, I'm from India but I moved to

Canada in 2013. I acknowledge we live and stand on Treaty 1 land. The land that we know and love was originally of the Anishinaabe, Ojibway, Cree, Oji Cree, and Dakota peoples, and the homeland of the Metis Nation. I acknowledge the harms & mistakes of the past such as broken treaties, residential schools, and stolen land. I am committed to learning about Indigenous histories and realities. I will work to build trust and collaborate with each other. I can plant prairie grass, shrubs, and sage. The plants will help the Indigenous to do ceremonies. In the past people would take plants but not re-plant & not take care of them. Taking care of the land is important because it gives us resources. Land should be treated with respect.

My name is Felix. My family comes from Vietnam and we live in Treaty 1 Territory. I acknowledge that I live on the traditional territory of the Anishinaabeg, Cree, Oji-Cree, Dakota, and Dene people and the National Homeland of the Red River Métis. I acknowledge that the water I drink comes from Shoal Lake 40 First Nation. For many years, the people of Shoal Lake did not have clean water. Meanwhile, people in Winnipeg did. This is not okay. We must do better.

My name is Jayce. I'm from Winnipeg and I live in Winnipeg.

My ancestors are from Garden Hill First Nation located in Treaty 5 Territory. I acknowledge that we are on Treaty 1 Land, the ancestral home of the Anishinaabe, Cree, Oji-Cree, Dakota and Dene people and the National Homeland of the Red River Métis. Treaty 1 was made on August 3, 1871, between the Anishinaabe and Muskegon Cree peoples and Queen Victoria, the reigning British monarch at the time.

The seven First Nations that are represented by Treaty Number One are:


Peguis First Nation, Sagkeeng First Nation, Brokenhead Ojibway Nation, Roseau River Anishinaabe First Nation, Long Plain First Nation, Sandy Bay Ojibway First Nation and Swan Lake First Nation. The water we drink is from Shoal Lake, which is located in Treaty 3 Territory.


I would appreciate if we could make communities for the Indigenous people healthier by making sure they have access to better food and more medicine - both western and traditional.




















Music News
