The electricity powering our community comes from generating stations on river in Treaty territories 1, 3, and 5. The Northern Flood Agreement with five Indigenous communities in northern Manitoba remains unfulfilled.

A Message From the Principals

Dear Families,

Throughout May, our school celebrated important events such as Asian Heritage Month and Mental Wellness Awareness Month. Our students showed a keen interest in learning about Asian culture and history, and our teachers have made a concerted effort to incorporate lessons about cultural diversity and heritage languages into their classroom instruction.

Many of our classes participated in the divisional SteamFest on May 17 at Maples Collegiate. This event introduced students of all levels to current and future careers in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM). It aimed to raise awareness of the value of STEM in everyday life, help bridge the STEM literacy gap, work towards equitable access to STEM, and encourage students' interest in these fields.

Our students also participated in the 'Arts In the Park (AITP)', an arts festival, hosted by the Seven Oaks School Division at Maples Collegiate on May 29, 30, and 31. This three-day, two-evening arts festival showcased the creativity of our students through musical performances, visual art, dance, drama, and student-created movies. Arthur E. Wright students and their work were well represented at the festival.

Also, our divisional Grad POW WOW is on June 6 at Maples Collegiate. Students who have joined the POW WOW club have been practicing for the Grad POW WOW under the guidance of our knowledge keeper and instructor, Harmony Lynxleg.

Meanwhile, our students have been engaged in rigorous literacy and numeracy work, while also taking breaks for mindfulness activities and other exercises designed to promote mental wellness. Our teachers emphasize the importance of maintaining healthy minds, bodies, and hearts to create a healthy world.

Outside the classroom, our students have been involved in a wide range of activities, including various sports, biking, running, and track and field. We are encouraging our community to use active modes of transportation to get to school as the weather is warmer. kitchen!





Our **Grade 8** students of the **Filipino Bilingual Program** were invited and recognized by MLA Mintu Sandhu at the Manitoba Legislative Building.




