Dear Parents and Guardians,

To help children be safe – and seen – this Halloween, Manitoba Public Insurance is pleased to provide wearable light flashers to all trick-or-treaters from Kindergarten through to Grade 6.

Road safety is important every day of the year, but Halloween presents unique challenges as large numbers of children are on community streets after dark.

Please keep your ghosts and goblins safe this year by using their wearable light flashers, and by following these important road safety reminders:

- Look in all directions for traffic before crossing the street.
- Never cross between parked cars.
- Always walk never run across the street.
- Take care when crossing at traffic lights and stop signs by waiting for vehicles to come to a complete stop and making eye contact with drivers.
- Remember that cars cannot stop quickly in wet or icy conditions.
- Be cautious of masks that may obscure your child's vision.
- Be cautious with dark costumes that may be difficult for drivers to see.
- Consider walking with your children or have them travel in groups.

You must have a permit to set off fireworks within the city of Winnipeg.

You can receive a \$500 ticket if you set off fireworks without a permit.

To be eligible for a permit you must:

- 1. Be 18 years or older.
- 2. Have 100 feet of clearance from all buildings and trees. Most private properties in Winnipeg do not meet this need.
- 3. Have written consent of the property owner.

If you are setting off fireworks as part of a City park rental, you also need a fireworks permit.

Firecrackers, which are loud, explosive fireworks, typically wrapped in paper and lit with a fuse, are illegal in Canada.

Vous devez détenir un permis pour allumer un feu d'artifice dans la ville de Winnipeg.

Vous pouvez faire l'objet d'une contravention de 500 \$ si vous allumez un feu d'artifice sans permis.

Pour être admissible à un permis, vous devez :

- 1. avoir au moins 18 ans;
- 2. prévoir 100 pieds de dégagement par rapport à tout bâtiment ou arbre (la plupart des propriétés privées de Winnipeg ne répondent pas à cette exigence);
- 3. avoir obtenu le consentement écrit du propriétaire.

Si vous allumez un feu d'artifice lors de la location d'un parc municipal, vous avez également besoin d'un permis de feu d'artifice.

Les pétards sont des feux d'artifice bruyants et explosifs qui sont normalement enveloppés dans du papier et dont on allume la mèche. Ils sont illégaux au Canada.
