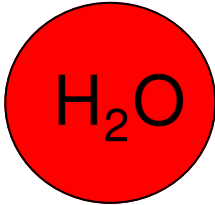
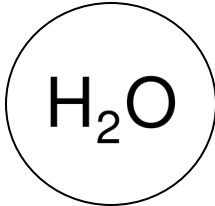
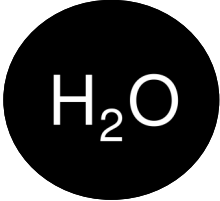
IMPORTANT REMINDERS & INFORMATION

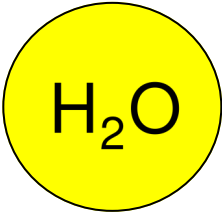
Please be sure to let the office know if your child will be away from school for any reason. You may phone and speak to a secretary or leave a voice-mail.

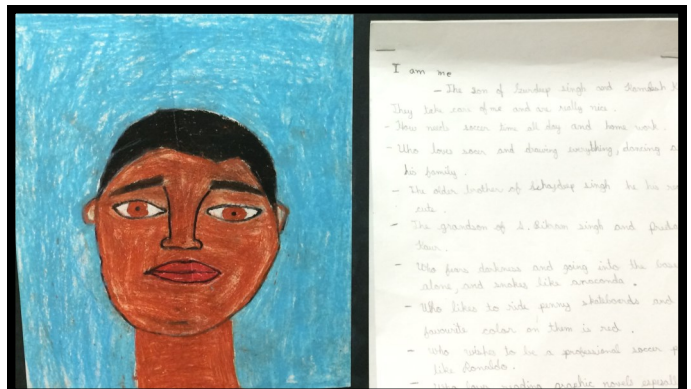
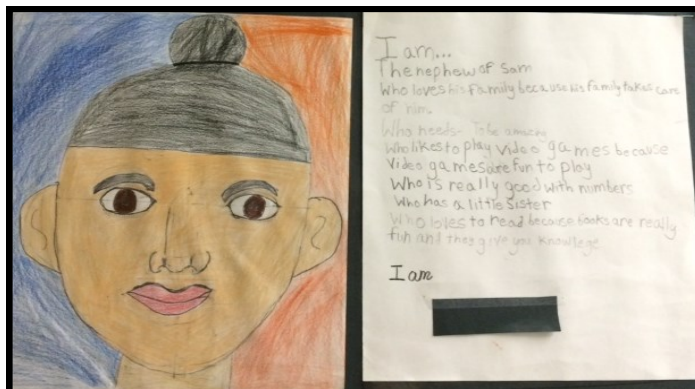
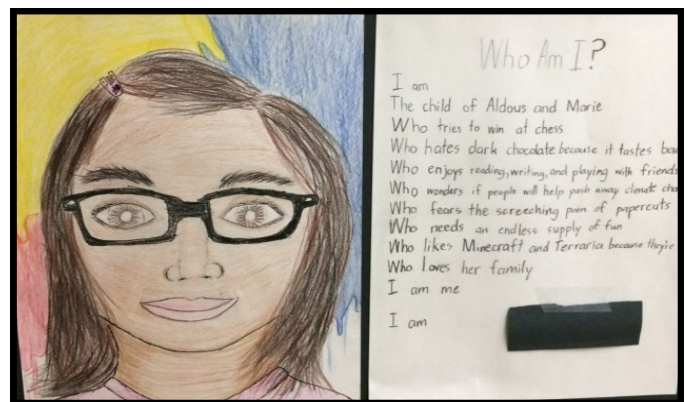
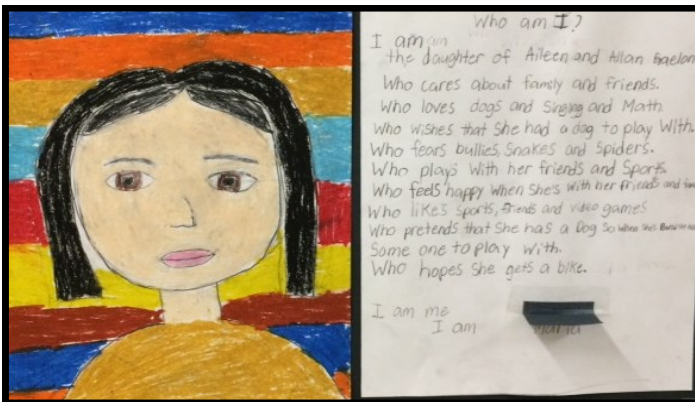


CELEBRATING “OUR” LEARNING

At AEW we love any opportunity we can get to celebrate the learning in our school! We are so pleased to be able to offer you a peek into the work we do at our school!



Mrs. Ingram’s Gr. 1./2 class did some great inquiry based learning! They tried their hand at creating glove greenhouses (planting The Three Sisters – Winter Squash, Corn and Climbing Beans). They also explored pumpkins, making predictions about them, sketching them and colouring their art work!

CELEBRATING “OUR” LEARNING

Ms. Wagner’s Grade 3/ 4 class were super excited to receive three special visitors with a generous gift for our classroom. Thiessen Topsoil, as part of their Live/Action program graciously donated a selection of 50 gourds and pumpkins to be used for hands-on learning activities within the classroom.

Imagine the look on the children’s faces as the three farmers brought wheelbarrow after wheelbarrow filled with pumpkins of all shapes and sizes and unloaded them into the corner of our classroom! We had our own pumpkin patch which the children enjoyed reading books in during our silent reading time or using during dramatic play as a “pumpkin house” to help inspire our creative writing efforts.

Thus far, we have used the pumpkins as a means to introduce the math concepts of estimation and measurement. We counted the lines and will be carving the faces and counting the seeds this week as well.

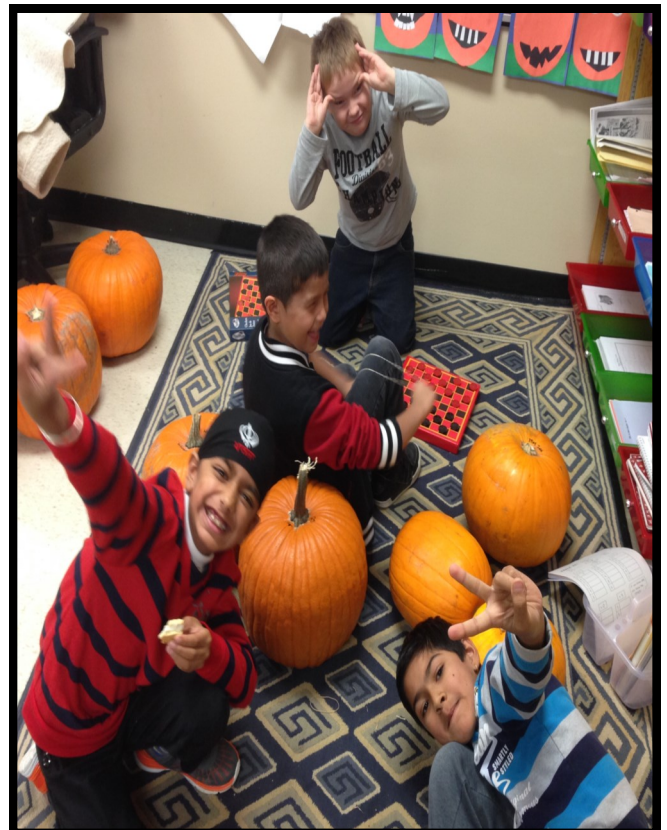
We transformed the gourds into spooky witches and discussed the art ideas of line, shape and proportion while practicing our sketching techniques. After Halloween we will roast the seeds and create posters to depict the life cycle of a common plant from seeds to seedling to flowering plant. Did you know that the pumpkin is the flower / fruit part of a pumpkin plant?

Best of all, of course, will be when all of our pumpkins have been carved into jack-o-lanterns to transform our classroom into an awesomely eerie backdrop for our school Halloween party. We can’t wait!
