Our ancestors are Ojibway, German, Cree, Anishnaabeg, Ininiwak, Chinese, Ukrainian, Mexican, Métis, British, Anishin-ininiw and Salvadorian. We are made up of Indigenous and Settler heritage from all over the world. Our school is located on Treaty 1 territory, and is the ancestral homelands of our peoples including the Red River Métis. To us, the land is a place for sport, a place to get a breath of fresh air, a place to rest, it is the Tallgrass Prairie and it is our provider. Our commitment as the caretakers of the land and as Indigenous youth is to decolonize as much as we can. Ekosi.
