




"In Flanders Fields"

Inspired by an award-winning book that we read in class, **THE REMEMBER BALLOONS**, written by Jessie Oliveros and illustrated by Dana Wulfekotte, Room 6 created artworks to pay tribute to the heroes of wars who gave their lives for our freedom and liberty. Applying the art style of an artist/poet Christopher Volpe, the students used a sponge to create a landscape using only three colors: brown, green and blue. We added the poppy flower from the poem of John Mccrae's **"IN FLANDER'S FIELD"** that we translated to Filipino, **"SA PARANG NG FLANDER."** We also included heroes from the Philippines as we remember the global heroes on **'REMEMBRANCE DAY.'**
