### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

At Victory, we wrapped up September with *Truth & Reconciliatoin Week*, an important time for reflection and action - Learning about our relationships as Treaty people, honouring Residential School Survivors, and remembering those who didn't come home. Last week, staff participated in a PD Day with the *Treaty Relations Commission of Manitoba* to learn more about Treaty relationships, our history as Treaty people and the importance of Treaty education to our shared future. On Tuesday, everyone gathered at the front of the school to raise the *Every Child Matters* flag. Classrooms continued learning about the significance of Orange Shirt Day during the week, and on Friday we held an assembly to highlight classroom projects and walk through our community as a lead-up to the National Day for Truth & Reconciliation.

Victory School is committed to this ongoing work, so that students can grow up with a true appreciation for what it means to live on Treaty 1 and to be Treaty people. See more in our *Victory Spotlight!* 

I also want to express my gratitude to our staff, volunteers and community for making our "Welcome Back Get-Together" a success. 
### **REMINDERS & UPDATES**

**Drop-off and pick-up times** are always busy, and **safety is our number one priority**. We would like to remind families and caregivers that the **bus loop** is reserved for school buses and divisional vehicles – we ask that you do not drive or walk through the bus loop at these times.

The parking lot is a high-traffic area as it is shared by Victory School, the Educational Resource Centre, the School Board Office and the West Kildonan Library. We discourage driving or walking through the parking lot for everyone's safety, and remind families that parking spots are reserved, paid spots.

Access paths to Victory are conveniently located close to street parking on Powers St. and Andrews St. and we encourage you to stop & drop at the **front door** on Jefferson Ave.

**Patrols** are stationed at Powers St., Andrews St. and at the parking lot entrance. Please, always follow the direction of patrols when crossing and wait for them to announce "Open" when it is safe to cross.





### **VICTORY SPOTLIGHT**



















### **VICTORY READS**

The Victory Reads title for October is "Métis Like Me" written by Tasha Hilderman, illustrated by Risa Hugo.



Are you Métis like me? A group of children of Métis descent share and explore all the ways they celebrate and experience their heritage - enjoying traditional foods like Bannock bread and Saskatoon berries; crafting with beads; sharing stories, dance, music and songs. Each child shares a different way they enjoy honoring their backgrounds and weaving parts of the rich tapestry that makes up Métis culture. One child, though, has grown up disconnected from their history and can't join in with the others in

the same way. But soon they see it's never too late to learn, celebrate or become a part of a community in which Métis and non-Métis alike can discover the richness of an often-overlooked culture.


