Today's community land acknowledgement is from M. Allard and Mme. Wiens' Advos:

We come together as treaty one people recognizing that we are on the original lands of the Anishinaabe, Nêhiyawak and Dakota peoples and the traditional homeland of the Red River Métis. Those among us who are not direct descendants of these original peoples come from all over Asia, Europe, Africa and the Middle East, and we have come with the understanding that we have inherited all the goodness and the ugliness that makes up our history. As we remember the wrongdoing of residential schools, of broken promises and so many abuses of the people and the land, we also want to give thanks and show our enormous gratitude for the infinite beauty of nature, for the food, water and oxygen it provides us with, for the calm and quiet place it allows us for contemplation and meditation. And for all of this we commit to being better; to remember to show gratitude for the changing seasons; for the ice and snow that are perfect for hockey and skiing and breathing the fresh crisp air, for the sun on our faces as we go camping and fishing or play basketball. We commit to consuming less and recycling more, to walking and biking when we are able and in all that we do, remembering to take our cue from the earth that supports all of us with enduring peace and love and without discrimination.
