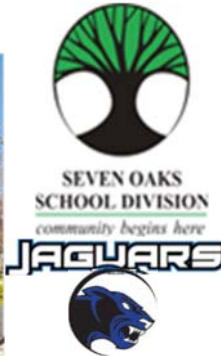


O.V. Jewitt Community School Report to the Community

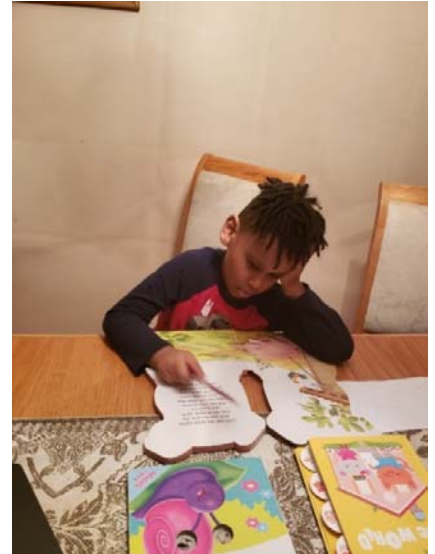
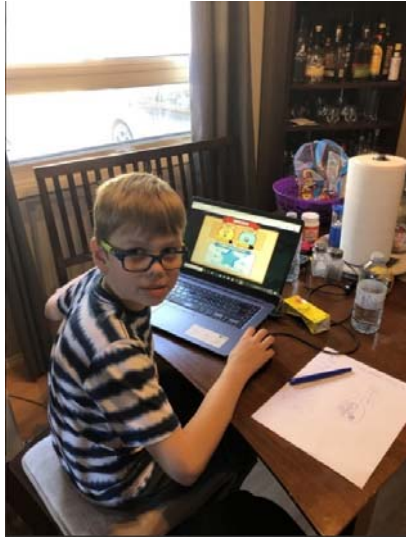


MAKING MUSIC

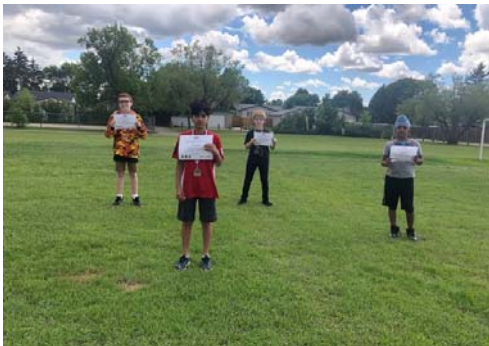

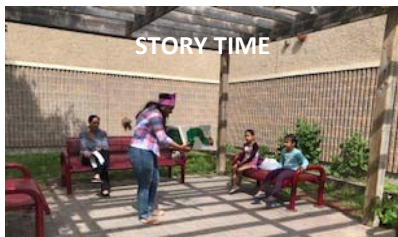
