We take time to acknowledge that we are here on Treaty 1 Territory, and to honour the Peoples and lands of Turtle Island. Treaty 1 land is on the traditional territories of the Anishinaabe, Inninewak, and Dakota peoples, and the homeland of the Red River Metis.

Our water comes from Anishinaabe Treaty 3 territory from the waters of Shoal Lake First Nation #39 and #40.

The electricity powering our community comes from generating stations on river in Treaty territories 1, 3, and 5. The Northern Flood Agreement with five Indigenous communities in northern Manitoba remains unfulfilled.

We are committed to our Treaty relationship. As a school community, we continually reflect on how we are contributing towards reconciliation today and everyday.

We are so glad to be back at school this year. This year has felt like a normal return since the COVID-19 pandemic hit in March 2020. It is exciting to see all students sitting on the carpet in their classrooms and reading a story together. It wasn't the same when everybody was spread apart. It feels as if the community is coming together once again.

Thank you for attending the orientation appointments held on the first week of school. We were very excited to meet up with both returning and new families before the start of classes.

Last year, we were hoping to activate a Parent Council because we know that together, we're better. For various reasons this did not happen. It will also give parents an opportunity and a place to voice ideas and concerns and connect with other families. In recognition of Truth and Reconciliation Week leading up to Orange Shirt Day on September 30th, our teachers have been engaging students to learn and reflect on the devastating and ongoing impacts of Canada's residential school system. A school assembly was held on September 29th where students had an opportunity to share their learning and growing understanding of Truth and Reconciliation. Our commitment to learning about and acting toward reconciliation will continue throughout the year.

Severe Weather and Bus Cancellations

Sometimes, severe weather causes us to cancel buses. The general rule is that if the temperature combined with the wind chill is -45 C or colder at The Forks (as posted by **Environment Canada** at 6:00 a.m.), we cancel buses for the whole day but schools usually remain open. All metro Winnipeg school divisions follow one system, based on this rule.

We will post an alert message on the Seven Oaks School Division website home page if buses are cancelled.

Major radio stations will also announce busing cancellations. They usually broadcast cancellations about every 15 minutes. You can also check local television stations and the Internet.

LIBRARY NEWS


Welcome back!!


Mrs. Ranouta's and Mrs. Sembhi's classes went to a field trip to Bruce D. Campbell Farm and Food Discovery Centre.
