Take your science education out of this world and gain a more complete understanding of our universe in **ASTRONOMY**.

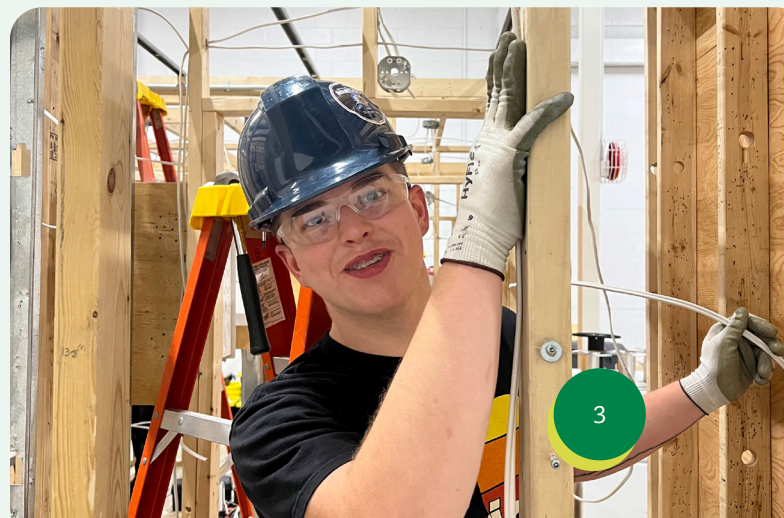
Our **FRENCH IMMERSION** programming cultivates bilingualism, boosts cultural awareness, and provides students with skills to communicate effectively in French.
